THE SERVEBETTER STORY



SP Nathan, a Director at Servebetter, attended a two days WIAL Foundations of Action Learning workshop at Kuala Lumpur in 2015 on his own initiative. He was curious about the AL process and had a burning question on 'how well can Action Learning help NGOs solve problems?' Nathan's greatest discovery about Action Learning was that it is a tool that emphasizes live experiences by providing actionable solutions instead of the traditional methodology of classroom learning.

From this point on, more Servebetter volunteers were exposed to Action Learning. They have gone on to actively participate in WIAL Malaysia's AL Community of Practice gatherings. Servebetter is a social enterprise, dedicated to supporting and facilitating the use of enterprises to empower individuals and NGOs.

In 2017, Servebetter applied for the Better world Fund to assist more NGOs in capacity building, especially with tools like Action Learning to improve their service delivery.

2017 WIAL Better Fund for Servebetter

The following is a summary of the WIAL Better World Fund projects carried out by Servebetter and WIAL Malaysia from June 2017 to February 2018, under two categories:

1. NGOs Leadership Development through Action Learning Coaching & Certifications.

This is to develop and empower the NGO leaders on leadership capacity building and team problem solving skills.

1.1 Foundations of Action Learning coaching for seven individual from seven NGO organizations recommended by Servebetter in June 2017 and January 2018.

2. Action Learning Coaching with the Leaders of The Montfort Boys Town, Shah Alam, Malaysia

Montfort provides academically and financially challenged youths the opportunity to equip themselves with the right skills and guides them in recognising their talents. This is done by providing practical vocational training and quality living skills which serve to, empower them with the confidence to live a successful and positive life.



As part of the programme in character formation, Montfort youths undergo a disciplines schedule of work, study, and play. Emphasis is given to leadership training in the course of their formation. The youths are also involved in the running of the Home. A Prefect system of management and reporting ensures that Montfort is a place managed for the Youth, by the Youth, and with the Youth.

2.1 Action Learning and Team Problem Solving on 11 September 2017

Fourteen heads of departments from the various training skills at Montfort were introduced to Action Learning, asking questions and reflections in problem solving.

2.2 The Everest in Me and Action Learning on 26th & 27 February 2018 at Montfort Boys Town

The Montfort Boys Town found the one day workshop in September 2017 beneficial, leading Brother Robin to personally request that Servebetter conduct another two days of action Learning workshop for all the Montfort Heads of Departments.

Although WIAL Malaysia has fully utilised the WIAL Better World Fund, we decided to run this as one of our community CSR contributions.
